

This Indenture witnesseth That Henry Huskisson (now living with his Mother at N^o 7 Chapel Place in the Parish of Saint Anne within the Liberty of Westminster in the County of Middlesex) one of the Poor boys lately belonging to the Secret Charity School of the said Parish by and with the Consent and approbation of the Trustees of the said School doth put him self Apprentice to

Alfred Greenes of N^o 13 Denmark Street in the Parish of Saint Giles in the Fields in the County of Middlesex Spur Maker

to learn his Art of a ~~Spur~~ Spur Maker and with him (after the manner of an Apprentice) to serve from the thirteenth day of February now last past unto the full End and Term of Nine Years from thence next following, to be fully, complete and ended. During which Term the said Apprentice h^{is} said Master faithfully shall serve h^{is} Secrets keep h^{is} lawful Commands every where gladly do he shall do no Damage to h^{is} said M^{aster} nor see it to be done of others, but that he to h^{is} power shall let or forthwith give warning to h^{is} said Master of the same he shall not waste the Goods of h^{is} said Master nor lend them unlawfully to any, he shall not commit Fornication nor contract Matrimony within the said Term he shall not play at Cards, Dice, Tables, or any other unlawful Games whereby h^{is} said M^{aster} may have any loss with h^{is} own Goods or others during the said Term without licence of h^{is} said M^{aster} he shall neither buy nor sell he shall not haunt Taverns nor Play-houses nor absent him self from h^{is} said M^{aster}'s Service Day nor Night unlawfully. But in all things as a faithful Apprentice he shall behave himself towards h^{is} said M^{aster} and all h^{is} during the said Term.

And the said Alfred Greenes in consideration of the faithful Services of the said Henry Huskisson and also in consideration of the sum of Two Pounds now paid him out of the funds of the said Charity School by The Reverend Dr. McLeod the Treasurer the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and also in consideration of the sum of Two Pounds to be paid him when the said Henry Huskisson shall have served half the term of his apprenticeship h^{is} said Apprentice in the Art of a Spur Maker which he useth by the best means that he can shall teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed Finding unto h^{is} said Apprentice sufficient Meat Drink Clothes Washing Lodging and all other necessaries during the said Term.

And for the true performance of all and every the said Covenants and Agreements either of the said Parties bindeth him self unto the other by these presents **In witness** whereof the Parties above named to these Indentures interchangeably have put their Hands and Seals the Eighth Day of October in the twentieth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord, George the Fourth by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland King Defender of the Faith and in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and twenty nine.

NOTE.—The Indenture, Covenant, Article or Contract, must bear date the day it is executed; and what money or other thing is given or contracted for with the Clerk or Apprentice, must be inserted in words at length, and the duty paid at the Stamp Office, if in London, or within the Weekly Bills of Mortality, within One Month after execution; and if in the Country, and out of the said Bills of Mortality, within Two Months, to a Distributor of Stamps or his Substitute; otherwise the Indenture will be void, the Master or Mistress forfeit 50l. and another Penalty, and the Apprentice be disabled to follow his Trade, or to be made free.—Children bound out by any Parish or Public Charity, is exempt from the duty.
